
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



CRETE FACTS



Facts about Crete

- Crete is the biggest Greek island, the 5th biggest in the Mediterranean, and the 88th biggest island in the world. It is divided into four regions, from West to East: Chania, Rethymno, Heraklio, and Lasithi.
- Crete is 260 km long (161 miles), and the width ranges from 60 km at its widest point (37 miles) to 11 km at its narrowest (7 miles). Its total area is over 8300 square kilometers (5157 miles), making it Greece's biggest and most populous island.
- Myth: The most important god in the Greek pantheon, Zeus, was born on the island, according to the legend he was born in a Cretan cave. One of the best-known legends in Greek mythology takes place in Crete, inside the palace of King Minos (Knossos Palace).
- Also, following the Greek mythological tradition, Hercules drove all harmful animals away from Crete in an attempt to please the god Zeus. As a result, all animals in Crete are harmless.

CRETE FACTS

- Crete is the birthplace of modern European civilization. The island's history can be traced back to the 7th millennium BC, more than four millennia before the Minoan civilization appeared on Crete. Besides, Knossos, now home to one of the most visited archaeological sites in Greece, is considered the oldest city in Europe.
- Crete was not a Greek island until December 1913, when it united with the country.
- Winters can be pretty cold in the White Mountains (Chania region), the Psiloritis
 (Rethymnon region), and the Dikti mountain range (Lasithi). The highest peaks see snow in
 winter.
- Different musical instruments originated on the island of Crete, including the laouto (or Cretan lute), the Cretan Lyra, and – some say – even the violin!
- Crete has its unique and own form of poetry, the mantinada. These short rhyming poems, often improvised, are usually performed with the music of the Cretan Lyra.
- Crete is home to the island of Gavdos, the southernmost point in Europe, about 170 nautical miles from Libya.
- Crete is home to animals growing nowhere else in the world. The most famous of them is the wild Cretan goat, known as agrimi or kri kri.
- Olive trees have thrived on the island for centuries. Some of the two oldest olive trees in the world are still alive and still produce olives.
- The sea in Crete is truly transparent. The waters on the coast are so clear that it's possible to have a 40-meter-deep view from above. Consequently, the island of Crete is home to the most beaches awarded a Blue Flag in Greece.
- The island was the birthplace of several influential artists, including the Cretan writer Nikos Kazantzakis and the Cretan Renaissance painter El Greco. Opera singer Nana Mouskouri was born in Chania, and soap opera actor, John Aniston (Jennifer Aniston's father) was also born there.
- Wine has been produced on the island since the Minoan Era in the Bronze Age. The island boasts 13 native grape varieties.

Knossos Palace

The Archaeological Palace of Knossos, in Heraklion, is the most famous Minoan site on the island. The complex is impressive, with about 1300 rooms connected by corridors and an entrance gate on each cardinal face.

These are some of the ingredients that define the famous beaches of Crete.

Lasithi Plateau

The silent area of the Lasithi Plateau, surrounded by the imposing heights of the Dikti Mountains, stands over 850 meters above sea level. The plains extending at the mountain range's foot are among the most fertile lands on Crete. The plateau covers a circuit over 23 kilometers long, following a road that links about 18 villages.

Dakos

Dakos is an appetizer featuring chopped tomatoes, olives, and crumbled feta or mizithra cheese on top of a slice of dried bread or barley rusk.



Gamopilafo

Gamopilafo is a main dish consisting of meat and poultry, next to rice cooked in meat broth. Traditionally, Gamopilafo is the primary dish in every wedding feast in Crete.



Antikristo

Antikristo, which means "across the fire," is a special cooking method popular among Cretans. It is used to grill lamb or goat.

Boureki

Boureki is a popular pie from Chania that consists mainly of potatoes, zucchini, mint leaves, and myzithra cheese



Kleftiko

Kleftiko is a dish that comes in are many versions, the main Cretan variation consists of a paper wrap cooked in the oven filled with meat, vegetables, and potatoes.



Kohli Bourbouristi

Kohli Bourbouristi are sails pan-fried in their shells, usually in hefty amounts of olive oil and different herbs to give the dish extra flavor.





Raki or Tsikoudia

Raki is he most popular alcoholic beverage in Crete made after the wine harvest.
